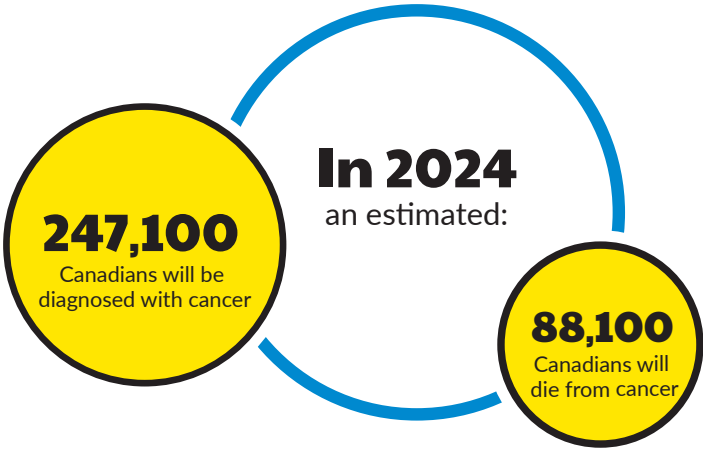


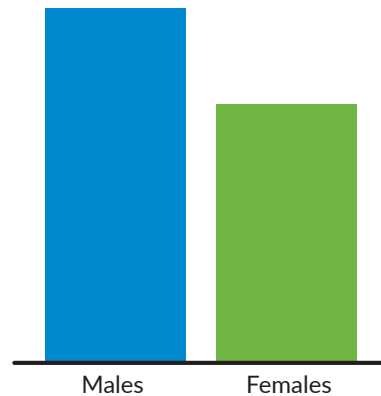
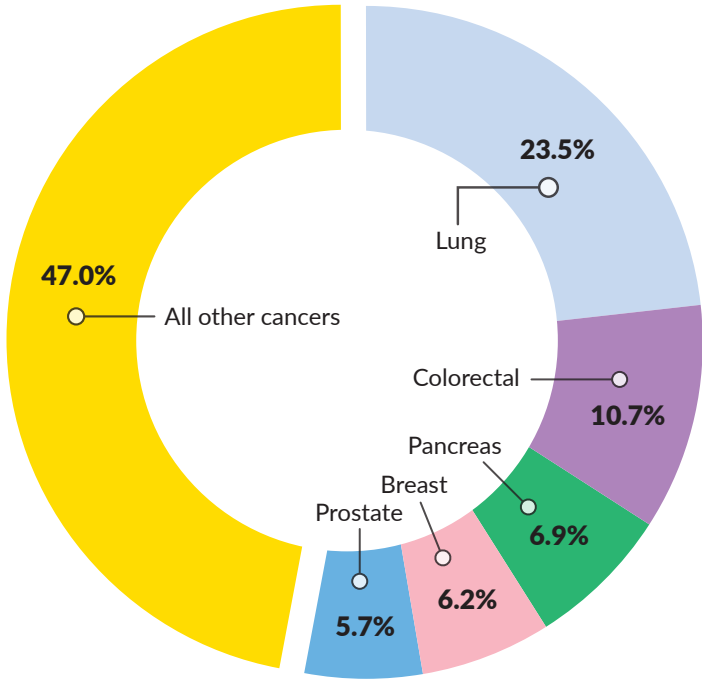
CANCER IN CANADA IN 2024

Projected estimates of cancer in Canada in 2024 is a study published in the Canadian Medical Association Journal (CMAJ). It provides new estimates of the number and rate of new cancer cases and deaths for 23 cancer types by province, territory and sex. Below are some of the key findings from the study.



THE 5 MOST COMMON CANCER DEATHS

are expected to account for over half of all cancer deaths in Canada in 2024.



CANCER DEATH RATES

are expected to be 37% higher in males than in females in 2024*.

*Cancer statistics are currently collected and analyzed based on assigned sex at birth or male/female binary.
