

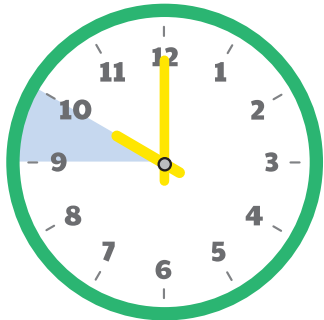
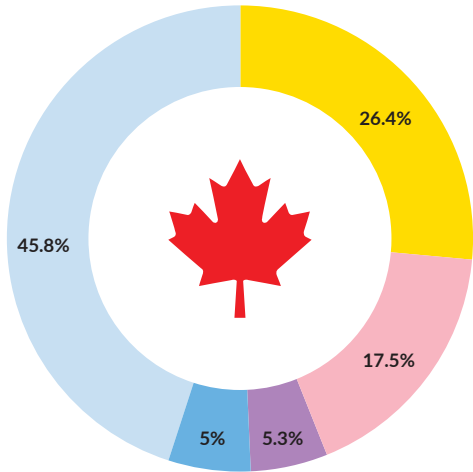
CANCER IN CANADA IN 2023

Canadian Cancer Statistics 2023 provides estimates of new cancer cases and deaths, as well as cancer survival by sex, age, year, province and territory for 20+ cancer types. The report also provides trends in cancer rates over time. Below are some estimates from the full report.

CANCER

remained the leading cause of death in Canada in 2020.

- Cancer
- Heart disease
- COVID-19
- Accidents
- All other causes



EVERY HOUR IN 2023,

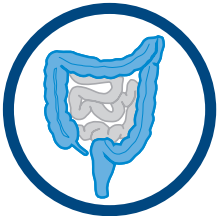
an expected 27 Canadians will be diagnosed with cancer and 10 Canadians will die of cancer.



LUNG CANCER

continues to be most commonly diagnosed cancer and remains the leading cause of cancer death in Canada.

However, in recent years, lung cancer death rates were declining faster than any of the other reported cancer types in Canada.



COLORECTAL CANCER

incidence rates were declining faster than any of the other reported cancer types in Canada in recent years.

SURVIVAL

decreases with increasing stage at diagnosis, according to a recent study published by Statistics Canada.
